What is eScholarship@UMMS?

eScholarship@UMMS is a digital repository offering worldwide access to the research and scholarly work of the UMass Medical School community. The goal is to bring together the University's scholarly output, in full text when possible, in order to enhance visibility and accessibility.

As part of the UMMS Women's Health Resources Dissemination Outreach Project, the [Women's Health Research Faculty Publication](#) collection showcases publications authored by UMMS researchers who specialize in women's health. An [Author Gallery](#) of faculty web pages of women's health researchers at UMMS is also included. This collection and gallery complement the [Women's Health Outreach Guide](#) and have been created in partnership with the UMMS Women's Faculty Committee and the UMMS Women's Leadership Working Group.

The [Women's Health Research Faculty Publication](#) collection is an important resource for researchers focused on women's health and women researchers. Content is immediately exposed to Google, Google Scholar, and other search engines. The collection enjoys wide exposure and serves as an excellent dissemination and discovery tool for journal articles, posters, presentations, and other scholarly works in Women's Health, allowing both researchers and their research to achieve greater impact.
